Now that their church is restored, they are able to celebrate Mass as a community. Con los fondos de esta colecta, los católicos de Georgia pueden reconstruir iglesias, brindar atención médica a los pobres y transmitir la fe a la próxima generación. Gracias por su apoyo.

One of the memorable scenes in an English novel of some years ago describes a little boy named Bron going to church for the first time with his governess. He watches with interest every part of the service. The preacher then climbs into the high pulpit and Bron hears him deliver a piece of terrible news about a brave and kind man who, a long time ago, was viciously ill treated, nailed to a cross, and who feels a dreadful pain even now because there is so much that needs to be done in accordance with his teaching. Little Bron thinks the preacher is telling the story so people will rise up and take the cause.

The service ends and to Bron's shock and surprise the people walk away as if they had not heard such terrible news, as if there was nothing that demanded their attention. Bron is crying as he leaves the church. When the governess discovers the reason, she says: "You shouldn't have taken all that the preacher said to heart. Quit your crying, people are going to think you are strange!"

The story gives us pause to consider how often we fail to do the right thing, how we hold back honest and rightful emotions, how we keep silent when a prejudice is stated, how we say nothing in the face of an injustice, all because we don't want to be thought of as strange.

Jesus was the perfect teacher. He presents to his students, His primary lesson: “Do to others as you would have them do to you.” (Luke 6:31). Then He offers concrete examples to illustrate His point: “do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you, … give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back.” (Luke 6:27-28; 30).

This is difficult to hear and an even more challenging one to enact. “Love your enemies” – not tolerate, make room for, listen to, or work beside, but love. (Luke 6:27). This kind of love is divine love. God loves us like this, without condition, without expectation. Jesus is calling on us to love as God loves, meaning, not just those who are easy to love but ALL people. One way we can answer this call is supporting programs and initiative, like the CASA, without requiring any acknowledgment or return gift save the knowledge that we are doing our best to take Jesus’ lesson to heart.
